1200'!!!!!!!!!! - On April 15th, the AMA issued the following statement: "AMA is excited to announce that we have been granted a National Authorization allowing our members at AMA club sites in Class G airspace to operate above 400 feet above ground level (AGL) for routine, day-to-day activities. Based on your location in Class G airspace, your site will have a new altitude limit of up to 700 feet or 1,200 feet AGL." A review of the FAA UAS map indicates that our club has received authorization to fly up to the 1200' limit. This authorization is for sunrise to sunset only with a 400' limit for nighttime operations. All other AMA Safety Guidelines remain in effect. An updated copy of our FRIA is attached.
